
**ORDER**

There is controversy between the parties in regard to the quantum of rice lifted by the dealer. According to the BDO, the dealer had lifted 1217.66 quintals and distributed 738.29 quintals. There is no controversy in regard to distribution but the quantum of lifting is seriously disputed. The dealer states that he had lifted only 740 quintals. BDO is not ready to satisfy whether 1217 quintals of rice had been lifted by the dealer or only 740 quintals.

Let the BDO come with proper proof of the dealer having lifted 1217 quintals of rice on the next date.

PDS dealer Bhola Prasad and BDO, Barh are present.

The statement dues provided by the BDO shows that when the scheme was closed the dealer was left with 241.13 quintals of rice. The value thereof would be Rs 3,30,334/-. He has deposited Rs 36,000/- up till now. Thus there is a demand of Rs 2,94,334/- left to be deposited by the dealer. The dealer is granted 15% rebate on the total demand. The dealer undertakes to deposit this sum after deducting 15% <sup>of</sup> ~~grain~~ within three months. If the demand is not deposited within three months, order for rebate will stand cancelled. The dealer will be entitled to payment of Rs 50/- per quintal on the grains lifted by him as transportation and handling charges.
