ORDER

PDS dealer Sunil Kumar is present. BDO, Kawwakol and the DDC, Nawada are also present.

The dealer had lifted 135 quintals of rice till 31/12/05. He distributed 90.50 quintals leaving a balance of 44.95 quintals. The price thereof @ Rs 1370/- per quintal would be Rs 61,581/-. The dealer has deposited Rs 27,990/-. Thus, there remains a balance of Rs 33,591/-. The dealer has not deposited 50% of the demand. Yet I have heard him. He states that he may be exempted from paying the said sum of Rs 33,591/- as the grains deteriorated. He had not produced any proof of rice having decomposed. In that view of the matter, no case for exemption stands made out. The case is therefore rejected. BDO/Certificate Officer will take steps in accordance with law.



ORDER

PDS dealer Geeta Devi is represented by her counsel Mr Raghuvir Chandrayan. BDO, Kawwakol and the DDC, Nawadah are present.

There was a demand of Rs 12,75,016/- against the dealer. She has not deposited anything up till now. The case therefore cannot be considered by this Commission. The case is rejected.

It may be stated that the dealer is entitled to receive Rs 13/- per quintal as transportation and handling charges on the total quantity of rice lifted by him. On deposit of the entire demand, the dealer can claim her demand from the DDC, Nawadah for payment of transportation and handling charges. It will be open to the DDC to adjust the transportation and handling charges against the demand of the State. The case is disposed of accordingly.

ORDER

Despite service of summon PDS dealer Hiralal Rajvanshi is not present. BDO, Hisua and the DDC, Nawada are present.

There was a demand of Rs 86,076/- against the dealer. He has deposited Rs 25,132/- which is less than 50% of the demand. Counsel submits that there is a criminal case in regard to embezzlement of the rice and therefore, Certificate proceeding should not be taken up. I regret there is no substance in the prayer. The dealer has not deposited 50% of the demand. His case is therefore rejected. Order for stay of proceeding stands exhausted. BDO/Certificate Officer will take action in accordance with law.
