ORDER

PDS dealer Dayanand Prasad is represented by his counsel Mrs Seema Singh. BDO, Hisua block is present.

This case had been taken ^{up} on 25/09/17. On that date counsel for the dealer had been informed that the demand was Rs 6,05,961/- payable by the dealer. On instruction of the client Mrs Singh stated that the dealer has deposited Rs 2,86,120/-. On that date she stated that the dealer was prepared to deposit the balance sum to constitute 50% of the demand. Today she states that nothing has been deposited. In that view of the matter, since 50% of the demand having not been deposited the case cannot be heard by this Commission. The case is rfejected.

BDO/Certificate Officer will proceed to take action in accordance with law.

ORDER

PDS dealer Triloki Prasad Gupta is represented by his counsel Mr D.N. Tiwary. BDO, Vijaypur is absent.

BDO considers himself to be too big to appear before this Commission. His attitude is deplorable. Instead of appearing himself he ^{has} sent some staff of the block. He must appear before this Commission on the next date otherwise the matter will be reported to ~~the~~ Government for his non-cooperation with the Commission. Let this order be communicated to the DM and DDC, Gopalganj.

The licensee PDS dealer was Harihar Sah. He is dead. In his place his son Triloki Prasad Gupta has been noticed to pay the price of 888.16 quintals of rice. The price thereof @ Rs 1370/- per quintal would be Rs 12,16,799/-. He has deposited some amount which neither the counsel for the dealer nor the Clerk of the block are able to say. The statement of demand shows that the dealer has to pay Rs 7,08,895/-.

The dealer has not deposited 50% of the demand. I am therefore ^{if unable} ~~not able~~ to hear the case of the dealer. After 50% of the demand is met I will hear the case. In the matter of deposit of 50% of the demand, the sum already deposited by the dealer will be adjusted. BDO will appear with a written report in regard to the demand of each dealer on the next date.
